AXIS ISVA SERVICE

We recognise that it can be extremely difficult to seek support following a rape or sexual assault. Our advisors will respect your wishes and give you impartial advice and guidance so you have the most appropriate support as well as all the relevant information to make an informed choice which is absolutely right for you.

We also understand that the thought of pursuing justice through the courts may well be too much to cope with. Our detailed knowledge of the courts and criminal justice system means that if you do decide to formalise a complaint to the police we can support you throughout the whole of that process.

Axis is an independent specialist support service for survivors of sexual violence. Our one to one support service provides a safe, secure and confidential place where you will be listened to in a respectful and non-judgmental way and be able to access the best advice and help.



Independent Sexual Violence Advisors (ISVAs) are independent support workers who are entirely focussed on you and enable you to access those services you may need in the aftermath of the trauma you have experienced.

They are trained to support you with any identified practical support needs.

We will:

- Provide free and impartial information, advice and support
- Conduct a comprehensive needs and risk assessment with you
- Develop an individual support plan tailored to meet your needs
- Help you access other support services
- Advocate your needs and wishes to other agencies if you wish
- Give you advice and guidance on a range of issues. Explain our safeguarding policies and obligations in case you, someone else or a child is at serious risk of harm
- Hold regular telephone calls or face to face meetings, as agreed with you

Our ISVA's provide practical support in areas such as:

- Harm from others
- Mental health and psychological wellbeing
- Coping mechanisms, social and cultural support
- Accommodation and housing

The ISVA Service has been vital





- Provide information and guidance about reporting to the police and the criminal justice system
- Support you from the report, throughout the investigation and to any court case and beyond.

The support provided will vary dependent on your needs and particular circumstances. What happens next is entirely your decision.



Our ISVA service also offers a free, confidential and specialist support service to young people and children aged from 11 upwards who have experienced any form of sexual violence or sexual abuse.

We understand the devastating impact that sexual abuse can have on a young person's life and we have a range of support services to help you through this most difficult of times.



PARENTING ISVA

Where a child aged 10 or under experiences sexual violence or sexual abuse we offer a Parenting ISVA service to the parent, quardian or carer of the child. Our parenting ISVA works with a non-abusive parent or guardian or in some cases, carer, providing them with the same Criminal Justice support that is provided throughout the other parts of the ISVA service. In addition we provide practical support, to put them in a better position to be able to support their child.
